Dr. Anna Nagurney is the John F. Smith Memorial Professor at the Isenberg School of Management at the University of Massachusetts Amherst. She is also the founding director of the Virtual Center for Supernetworks and the Supernetworks Laboratory for Computation and Visualization.

Nagurney devotes her career to education and research that combines operations research/management science, economics, and engineering. Her focus is the applied and theoretical aspects of decision-making on network systems, particularly in the areas of transportation and logistics, energy and the environment, and economics and finance.

She received her AB, ScB, ScM, and PhD degrees from Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. She has authored or co-authored 9 books and more than 125 refereed journal articles. Professor Nagurney has been featured in Science and was named an Intellectual Leader in Regional Science according to the number of citations to her published articles.
