The Partnership with KSE Flourishes

The partnership established between the University of Massachusetts Amherst and the Kyiv School of Economics (KSE) continues to flourish. On the afternoon of February 27, 2025, we hosted a panel at the Isenberg School of Management with the 4 exchange students from the Kyiv School of Economics (KSE) in Ukraine. Professor Anna Nagurney thanks the UMass Amherst INFORMS Student Chapter and its President, Doctoral Student Center Associate Ismael Pour, for designing a nice flyer for the event and for handling the promotion and logistics.



It was an honor for Professor Anna Nagurney to moderate this panel with her colleague, Dr. Bogdan Prokopovych.

On March 7, 2025, Dr. Tymofiy Mylovanov, the long-term President of KSE, returned for his third visit to UMass Amherst. Despite Russia's full-scale war on Ukraine, now in its fourth year, enrollment at KSE has tripled; many new programs have been started, including in engineering, and, through its KSE Institute, numerous timely white papers have been published that are regularly cited in the media. KSE, even in wartime, has hosted many dignitaries and thought leaders.

The Center Director, who continues to serve as a Co-Chair of the Board of Directors of KSE, and is on its International Academic Board, helped to organize his visit and talk, with assistance from the Office of Global Affairs and the UMass Amherst INFORMS Student Chapter.

Thanks to the Office of Global Affairs at UMass Amherst and its Director, Vice Provost Dr. Kalpen Trivedi, and Kim Stender for organizing the excellent lunch at The Commonwealth Restaurant and with Provost Fouad Abd-El-Khalick, Dr. Trivedi, the Dean of Social and Behavioral Sciences Dr. Karl Rethemeyer, and Isenberg School Senior Associate Dean Lisa Masteralexis joining.

Since President Mylovanov was having a big birthday in a few days, we surprised him with dessert and Happy Birthday and his name written out in chocolate.

Afterwards, we had a terrific, informal Meet and Great in the Elkins Room at the Isenberg School, which included the exchange students from KSE, some of our Operations Management PhD students, the OIM Department Chair, Professor Senay Solak, and Professor Bogdan Prokopovych.

Two of the KSE exchange students have been with us for two academic years and are now returning back to Ukraine. Two are staying on for another year and we expect additional ones to arrive in the Fall.

The Center Director invited the students for a special dinner in order to celebrate their accomplishments. The dinner was at The Inn at Boltwood in downtown Amherst. The warm conversations covered much territory - the students' classes and great professors, friends made from Massachusetts and from around the globe, the award-winning UMass Amherst food, college sports (notably, UMass hockey), life in

beautiful Amherst, and the differences between learning in the US and in Ukraine. Traveling thousands of miles from their homes and their families, the students: Asta Motrenko, Marharyta Nechytailo, Oleksandra Horusieva, and Karyna Lutsenko have achieved so much and have left a big imprint on all those who have had the pleasure of interacting with them.

On March 28, 2025, Professor Anna Nagurney spoke at the University of Louisville in Kentucky. She was hosted by Professor Lihui Bai, who, along with Professor Monica Gentili, co-directs the Logistics and Distribution Institute there. Professor Nagurney had the pleasure of meeting with Professor Bai's PhD students, who even made presentations to her, and tremendously enjoyed seeing the campus. She even received a tour of where the Kentucky Derby takes place each spring. The research at the Institute is highly relevant and impactful. Professor Nagurney was delighted to hear about how variational inequalities are being applied to multiple problems related to sustainability there.

In her seminar presentation, the Center Director discussed agricultural supply chain networks as essential to food security and a major component of global trade. She described how optimization and game theory are being utilized to model and solve agricultural supply chain problems subject to a spectrum of trade instruments; how to capture fresh produce quality in multitiered supply chains, and how to measure resilience in order to mitigate against disruptions under conditions such as the pandemic, climate change, and wars. She also discussed how we can better promote our research contributions in order to influence

policy and effect positive change.
